Commodore's comment

During the past few weeks, the detached floating weed on the lake has started to cause problems with sailing activities. Whilst in previous years, small work parties have managed to keep the lake clear, the volume of floating weed has meant that sailing activities have been negatively impacted. The decision was made to bring Aquaclear back on-site for a day to use their specialist machine for moving as much weed as possible onto the banks so as to improve the sailing experience. This activity took place on



Thursday 16th, but will need to be followed up by a work party to remove it from the banks to the two storage locations that we have. The scheduled work party for Saturday 2nd October has been advanced a week to Saturday 25th September to address this (a note has already been sent out to the membership informing everyone of this change).

During the Winter months, I run a work party every Thursday between 09:30 and 16:00. The primary objective is to carry out the annual maintenance activities of the club along with any special projects which have been agreed by the committee. These work parties have a regular following and tend to be a mixture of both work and social and many members have gained practical knowledge from them over the years. Attendance is voluntary and at the beginning of each week, I send out an email to potential attendees of what the plans for the Thursday are.

If you are retired and might be interested in joining us, please let me know (coates_david@hotmail.com) and I will add your name to the email address list.

With the current easing of Covid restrictions, the club is looking to re-starting some of activities which couldn't occur during the previous 18 months.

As of Saturday 25th September, the monthly Junior club meeting will re-start. This takes place between 12:30 and 16:00 on the Saturday. The event is organised and run by the juniors and therefore parents retain responsibility. The club will ensure that a safety boat is manned on the lake during water activities. If the take up is reasonable during the remainder of 2021, then we will be looking to expand the offering to this club group from early next year.

Within the club there are a number of qualified Day Skippers, most of whom have undertaken the theory side of the qualification via evening classes, run by the club during the Winter months. Due to Covid, it wasn't possible to run the theory course last Winter but if there is

enough demand this Winter, then the club will make every attempt to organise an RYA approved Day Skipper theory course between November and March. If you are interested in joining the course, please let me know ASAP (coates_david@hotmail.com).

Pete also won the Sunday Summer Handicap series and Sir Peter Scott Trophy, with Alastair taking honours in the Personal Pursuit (I'll need a super-computer to calculate his handicap for next season). The Club Championship is being led by Mike Crowley, with Pete Dalton in second place. There are two championship days left in the calendar and by my quick reckoning, it might go down to the very last race.

Just a reminder that we have scheduled another **junior series** this year, with a slight tweak to the Racing Programme. On September 16 and 26, and October 10, 17 and 24, the Class race will start at 1400, and the Pursuit at 1545 (i.e. they will swap). There will be a Junior start in the class race 2 minutes after the Solo fleet starts. It is very likely that the Junior race will finish before the other fleets to keep it to a reasonable time.
